### **Jersey Shore Rescue Mission Coat Drive:**

# Upcoming Mission Opportunities



#### **Rise Against Hunger:**

On Sunday, April 21, 2024 we will be hosting our annual meal packing event with our mission partners Rise Against Hunger. Rise Against Hunger targets remote communities within areas that are designated serious or higher on the Global Hunger Index. These communities are the hardest to reach, have limited to no outside communication, and have poor infrastructure. With the support of partners, like us, they provide expertise to

empower the communities to become self-sufficient. Their work starts with providing meals through local school to incentive attendance and enable kids to get an education. When the meals are boxed at a meal packing event they are the last hands that will touch them until they are opened at the school to be given to a child in need.

Packing 25,000 meals sounds like a tall order, but with all of us joining together it is so much fun! No matter your age or level of mobility we have a job for you! From our energetic runners to the powerful fill team to our meticulous weighers, there is something for you to do. We are looking for 150 people to join us so we can complete our task in about 2hrs. And yes, we have beaten that time in years past! We are also still accepting donations to purchase the meals. The food, packaging, and shipping costs are covered by us for a total of ~\$9,500. Please join us in supporting this amazing organization.

## **Haiti Lunch Program Update:**

Thank you to all who continue to donate to the Haiti Lunch Program. As Carol shared with us during her update, things in Haiti are not good. Our friends at the orphanage had to leave through a hole in the wall to escape the escalating gang violent in Bon Repos. The church and school that we sponsor in Ganthier continues to be a beacon of light and hope in an area that continues to see an increase in violence and gang activity. We send them \$1,200 a month which was originally meant to



feed 100 children. The school has seen a drastic increase in enrollment due to families

fleeing from surrounding communities to Ganthier. We are asking for you to prayerfully consider becoming a monthly partner for the Haiti Lunch Program. The current donations do not cover our commitment amount and the Mission Committee has been supplementing it from the general Mission funds raised. We are looking for. If 60 families were to give just \$20 every month to the Haiti Lunch program it would be self-sufficient.
